

Year 6 Easter Holiday Revision



You have already put in lots of hard work to get ready for your SATs. Just to keep your learning brains ticking along, we have set some revision tasks for the Easter holidays.

We have two very simple rules:

- 1) Aim to revise on 10 different days. A little bit of revision is best, (30 minutes maximum each day.) Remember, relaxing and having fun is also very important.
- 2) Think about what you need to spend some extra time on. It is best to revise things you are not sure about so that you make the most of your time. If it's too hard, don't worry, just make a note and ask us after Easter.

Revision tasks to choose from:

You could use sections of your **revision books** to work on if this will help you. (If you don't have revision books, you could use your homework books. Revision books will be more useful though.)

Go through your **mock SATs papers** (the 2023 ones) and correct the questions you got wrong. This is particularly useful for the SPaG and Maths papers.

'Ten for Ten Easter Practice Booklet' – 10 minutes Maths practice. Each day includes arithmetic and reasoning questions.

Personalised Arithmetic booklets - These give you the chance to practise the types of questions that you made mistakes on in your mock SATs Arithmetic paper.

'10-4-10 English Reading Booklet' — 10 minutes Reading comprehension practice.

'10-4-10 Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling Booklet' – 10 minutes SPaG practice.

Y3/4 and Y5/6 Spellings — You know which spellings you are trying to learn. Practice a few each day to improve how many you know. (These spelling lists are on your class page.)

Reading – Reading something that you enjoy as often as you can.

- Log onto Read Theory for some extra practice.

Remember, revision WILL help you, but please don't overdo it; just like you shouldn't overdo the Easter eggs! Good luck and enjoy your holidays.
